FEEDBACK FROM THE COMMITTEE by G3SXW

Committee welcomed two members Andy G3AB and Fred G4BWP at its meeting on 19th December. Many important matters filled the next hour or so during a Skype conference-call which worked very well.

Membership Secretary, Tyler N4TY, reported exactly 500 full members plus 20 Associates. The Objection to G3SJJ's membership was again, as last year, upheld on the basis of many strong submissions which expressed a range of serious grounds. It was also agreed that in future Objections will be investigated and adjudicated immediately upon receipt, instead of waiting until the end of the 6-month Nomination period.

Subscription renewals continue with a big majority completed on the www.g4foc.org web-site. This really helps to cut the cost of volunteer time.

The Annual Dinner will again be held at Milton Keynes, on 8th November 2014, with the Bletchley Park tour and an afternoon programme of presentations at the hotel.

With the enormous efforts, for which the Club is very grateful, of G3LHJ, N4TY, S57WJ and WB2YQH all materials are ready ahead of schedule for mailing to members: the 2014 Call-Book, FOCUS (for those who chose to continue to receive it in printed form), a 2014 Calendar created by Gabor S57WJ and Marathon tick-sheets.

The new Call-Book contains updated information about all aspects of the Club. Members are encouraged to keep it handy and use it as the first port of call for any information, not just as a membership directory. The same is said of our g4foc.org web-site. In particular, and again thanks to N4TY, we now have a more complete set of guide-lines about Sponsoring. Please read this as it reflects the FOC culture! Hopefully, future Nominations will avoid Objections, each one of which is deemed potentially damaging to the Club.

- 1AØKM will be activated from SMOM January 2-7. Joining IKØFVC will be 17 operators including our \$53R. QSL via IKØFTA and LoTW. http://www.1a0km.org (Thanks, OPDXB)
- **5X1XA** If you missed Alan, **G3XAQ**, as 5X1XA from the capital city of Kampala, he is expected to return again and be active between 25th February and 16th March. Activity will be CW only. He will also be in the RSGB Commonwealth Contest (8th-9th March). QSL 5X1XA via G3SWH.
- Australs A group of six operators from the UK will operate from the island of Raivavae in the Australs (IOTA OC-114) from 20th March until 1st April, all bands CW, SSB and RTTY. The operators are Don G3BJ, Chris G3SVL, Nigel G3TXF, David G3WGN, Don G3XTT, Hilary G4JKS and Justin G4TSH. They plan to run up to three stations, each consisting of a K3 plus amplifier. Antennas will consist of various vertical systems on the beach. The team will upload logs to Club Log and, bandwidth permitting; will also be uploading to LoTW as the expedition progresses. QSLs will be handled by G3TXF and requests can be made directly or via the Club Log OQRS facility. After the DXpedition most members of the team will be attending the International DX Convention at Visalia. A website will be launched with further details once the callsign and other details are confirmed.
- BW/DJ3KR Juergen was QRV from Taiwan 11-26 November 2013 as BW/DJ3KR, only CW and 1500 QSOs (all bands 3.5 28 MHz). It could have been more, but I had to be busy with teaching most of the time. Over more than 15 years now, my Taiwan callsign prefix changed a few times from BV3, BX3, BW3 to BW, but operation was always from the campus of the National Central University in Chung-Li, a little south of Taipei. I again enjoyed contacts with guite a few FOC members.

- G3RXP You may have noticed that Dave was using the special contest call G4X during CQWW, however Ofcom had duplicated the call and it was in use by GM4X. Fortunately the two calls are not exactly the same, so both logs have been accepted. Dave's new Special Contest Call is G5U and he used it for a couple of hours in the 10m CW test. The moral of the story is, don't answer the telephone during a contest.
- G3TXF Nigel headed back to the Caribbean for some fun and sun. As to the fun he was QRV as PJ7/G3TXF from Sint Maarten from December 4-11. Listen for him on CW only, mostly on the 79-WARC bands. - GM3POI Clive was QRV in the ARRL 10m test using his other callsign, GM3X, single mode CW.
- **GM3WUX** Terry hasn't quite gone through everything yet, but he just put the tower up to 50 FT, wound the amp up to full legal and gave the CQ WW over 32 hours. 3488 entries in the log, claimed score just over 2,600,000 points. This is the best he has ever done. Conditions were good so I suppose everyone else will have done at least comparably well. That's my Single Op, All Band, Non-Assisted, High Power contribution to this excellent event.

- **GW3NJW** It is my sad duty to report the passing on 21st November of my dear friend Clive GW3NJW, who I first met in Cardiff High School in 1952 when we were in the same form. We obtained our licences together and operated very many Field Days together from 1960 to 1995. This stretched from Cardiff RSGB Group GW5BI and GW4FW in 1960, GW3XEJ Cardiff Radio Contest Club from 1966, through GW5ZL Swansea Group, Red Dragon GW8GT, and Contest Cambria GW7X. Clive fought very bravely against a serious illness for several years. The funeral was held at Thornhill Crematorium in Cardiff on December 11th. The service was attended by seven South Wales amateurs and many relatives. Amateurs attending were all friends of Clive, GW3NWS, GW3LEW, G(W)3OAY, GW3RIH, GW3SQX, GW4BLE, GW4JBQ, and GW5NF. RIP Clive you were a great friend and a great operator. (Thanks, G3OAY)
- IKØIXI Dec. 1, 2013, Fabio took part in the Salvatore "Sal" Marino IKØATK's 100th birthday celebration. Born in 1913 near Naples, Salvatore started his military career in the Regio Esercito (Italian Kingdom Army) in 1933. He was a young artillery sergeant in 1937 when he was involved in Ethiopian colonial war. When in Gondar, he became radio telegrapher and was sent on the shores of Lake Tana as operator of the anti-aircraft network. The net operated in CW only, with few Watts and wire antennas. Thanks to this simple radio circuit, Sal and the other operators were able to save many lives during RAF attacks. In Nov. 1941 he was captured by English troops after the famous Siege of Gondar and spent more than 5 year in the Zonderwater (South Africa) POW camp. During his long prison stay in the camp, Sal studied English and after the armistice of September 8, 1943 Sal joined the part of Italy that fought on the side of the Allies. He came back home in late 1946, after almost 10 years passed in Africa. He retired in 1969 from Italian Army after a long career as CW operator and instructor. Still today at 100 years, Sal is an avid CW operator, INORC Honour Member, HSC and VHSC. You may find him on 7025 every day. He likes to use PC, Internet and other modern stuffs. - J34G G3PJT, Bob will once again be active as J34G from Grenada (NA-024, WLOTA 0718) between the 3rd 10th March. Activity will probably be holiday style using a K2 w/100 watts and vertical antennas. He plans to also be in the RSGB's Commonwealth Contest (8th 9th March). Look for him outside of the contest, especially on 80 and 30 meters. QSL via his home callsign.
- **K6KII** Cliff and Janice were in the process of relocating to Fort Collins, CO, and were delayed due to an unfortunate accident (hitting a bull elk crossing Interstate 25 in New Mexico) which totaled their vehicle; but they are both OK.
- MØDXR Mark has settled in at Church Langley, Harlow, Essex. Do you have room for the rhombic now, Mark?
- N4AF Howie will be activating W1AW/4 for NC in the ARRL Centennial in the first week of January. http://n4af.net
- VK6VZ Steve has been off the air for the last six months, rebuilding his antennas. He built a 40m mini Moxon 2-element beam, but getting it right has been driving him mad. He finally has it just about sorted.
- VQ9JC The license for Jim has been renewed. Renewal encountered "an administrative hiccup," a change of official in charge, keeping him off the air for a month as the official checked into how ham license approvals are done. Once the answer came, approval was quick. Jim has been visiting the Chagos for 15 years. He is now operating "field day style" from a covered picnic table at a park which has AC available and "dozens of gecko lizards chasing the bugs." He is 30 feet from "the wall of the jungle" and is trying to "thread a 135-foot OCF dipole through all the trees so that he can leave the antenna up with multi-band capability." It can't be visible as 150-pound-test fishing line used to hold it up and the copper wire are both precious commodities there. The OCF dipole does not work on 15, 30 or 60 even with a matchbox, so separate dipoles for 15 and 30 will be put up and, maybe, for 60. The 80M OCF is going to be a big enough project, and will just be 25 feet high. Jim will have dipoles on the ship, where he will sign /MM. His rig is an FT-857D, 100 watts. He hopes to get the VQ94JC callsign for later in the year.

- WRTC2014 Dave Sumner, K1ZZ, will be Chief Judge for WRTC2014 as well as the following judges from the FOC. G3SXW, Roger; G4BUO, Dave; K4BAI, John; K6NA, Glenn; KC7V, Mike; N3RD, David; N5AW, Marvin; S53R, Robert; VK2IA, Bernd; and VK4EMM, John.
- WiFi routers into the 2.4 GHz ham band Al2Q, Alex, inspired by articles in recent issues of RadCom and QST, converted home wireless network WiFi routers into the 2.4 GHz ham band. The Cisco Linksys routers, now "flashed" with Amateur Radio code and using his callsign, are on the air on the 13-cm band as digital Broadband Hamnet rigs (also known as High Speed Multimedia Network- Mesh). HSMM-Mesh is a dynamic computer network that automatically recognizes stations as they appear in the mesh, and lets participating nodes automatically route computer traffic. If any member would like to receive his "Old Buzzard's Guide to Getting Started With HSMM-Mesh," please drop him an email and he will forward the Word file. If you're on the air with high-speed mesh, he'd like to communicate with you on CW, by email, or landline. (Ed. Note: This is neat!)
