The Caledonian Hotel, affectionately known as “The Caley,” is a landmark of luxury and elegance in the heart of Edinburgh. Originally built in 1903 as part of the old Princes Street Railway Station, this iconic building has a rich history, blending Edwardian grandeur with modern sophistication.

Today, the Caledonian Hotel operates as a premium 5-star Waldorf Astoria property, operated by the Hilton group offering world-class hospitality while preserving its historic charm. Guests can still admire original architectural features, such as the grand sandstone facade, which hints at its railway heritage.

Nestled at the west end of Princes Street, the hotel boasts breathtaking views of Edinburgh Castle and offers convenient access to the city’s main attractions. From here, you can explore:

- **Princes Street Gardens**, a tranquil green space just steps away.
- **Edinburgh Castle**, perched high above the city and steeped in history.
- **The Royal Mile**, a bustling historic street leading to Holyrood Palace.

Inside the hotel, guests enjoy refined dining experiences, including. The Caledonian also features luxurious spa and leisure facilities, offering a serene retreat after a day of sightseeing.

The Caledonian Hotel is holding some rooms for FOC members until May 16th. Rates are £445 for a single and £470 for a double, inclusive of a full Scottish buffet breakfast, Wi-Fi, and access to leisure facilities.

For more budget-friendly options, there are plenty of alternatives nearby, particularly around Princes Street, where all the action is. Premier Inn for example offers rooms starting around £150 for a double, and there are also numerous AirBnB options available. Booking.com would be a good place to review potential options.

There are plenty of hotels, bed & breakfasts, and Airbnb options available for those who prefer to stay elsewhere in town. Several members have already booked at the Premier Inn Edinburgh, which is conveniently located nearby and offers competitive rates.

Edinburgh attractions

Edinburgh is a city of history, charm, and stunning views. Explore the iconic Edinburgh Castle, stroll the Royal Mile, visit the Palace of Holyroodhouse, or step aboard the Royal Yacht Britannia. For spectacular scenery, hike Arthur's Seat or wander the city's historic streets. A perfect blend of culture, heritage, and Scottish spirit awaits!

Note: Edinburgh is busy year-round, and most places typically require online booking in advance.



- Edinburgh Castle <<https://www.edinburghcastle.scot>> – Perched atop Castle Rock, this iconic fortress boasts breathtaking views and is home to the Scottish Crown Jewels. Visitors can experience the 1:00 PM gun salute and explore the site with an informative audio guide. Entry tickets start from £35 per person.
- Royal Mile – A historic street connecting the Castle to Holyrood Palace, filled with shops, pubs, and street performers.
- Holyrood Palace – <<https://www.rct.uk/visit/palace-of-holyroodhouse>> The official residence of HM King Charles in Scotland, this historic palace features stunning gardens and a rich heritage. Located at the end of the Royal Mile, entry starts from £18 per person.
- Arthur's Seat – A scenic hike up an extinct volcano providing panoramic views of the city.
- The Scotch Whisky Experience – Learn about Scotland's national drink and enjoy whisky tastings.

- The National Museum of Scotland – A free-entry museum showcasing Scottish history, culture, and science.
- Princes Street Gardens – A beautiful green space with views of the Castle, perfect for a relaxing stroll.
- Calton Hill – A short climb rewards visitors with some of the best cityscape views and famous monuments.
- The Royal Yacht Britannia <<https://www.royalyachtbritannia.co.uk>> – Explore the former royal yacht of the late Queen Elizabeth II, now a fascinating floating museum. Enjoy a self-guided tour lasting approximately 2 hours, with entry from £20. Open daily from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM.
- Edinburgh's Underground Vaults & Ghost Tours – Experience the city's darker history with spooky guided tours.

Traveling Around Edinburgh

Edinburgh is a beautiful and compact city, making it easy for visitors to explore its historic streets, stunning landmarks, and vibrant neighbourhoods. Walking is one of the best ways to experience the city's charm, especially in areas like the Royal Mile, Princes Street, and the Old Town, where cobbled streets and hidden closes reveal centuries of history. Comfortable shoes are recommended, as some routes can be steep.

For longer distances, the city has an excellent public transport system. Lothian Buses operate frequently across Edinburgh, with contactless payments and day passes available for unlimited travel. The city's tram service provides a quick and scenic route from the airport to the city centre, stopping at key locations along the way. Taxis and ride-sharing services like Uber and Bolt are widely available for more convenient travel, especially at night.

For those who want a more guided experience, hop-on, hop-off sightseeing buses offer an easy way to visit Edinburgh's major attractions, including Edinburgh Castle, Holyrood Palace, and the Royal Yacht Britannia. Bike rentals are available for cycling enthusiasts, though Edinburgh's hills and cobbled streets can make some routes challenging.

Trains from Waverley Station connect Edinburgh to other parts of Scotland, making day trips to Glasgow, Stirling, or the Highlands easy. While renting

a car is a great option for exploring the countryside, it's not the most practical way to get around the city due to traffic and limited parking.
